Nanaimo Bars

Bottom Layer

- ½ cup unsalted butter at room temperature
- ¼ cup sugar
- 5 tbsp cocoa powder
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 ¼ cups graham cracker crumbs
- ½ cup finely chopped almonds
- 1 cup coconut

Combine the butter, sugar and cocoa powder in a double boiler and heat until melted. Slowly drizzle the hot mixture into the beaten egg, whisking constantly until thickened. Stir in the graham cracker crumbs, almonds, and coconut. Press the mixture firmly into an ungreased 8" x 8" baking pan.

Middle Layer

- ½ cup unsalted butter at room temperature
- 3 tbsp whipping cream
- 2 tbsp vanilla pudding powder
- 2 cups icing sugar

Cream together the butter, cream, vanilla pudding powder and icing sugar until light. Spread over bottom layer.

Top Layer

- 4 oz semi-sweet chocolate
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter

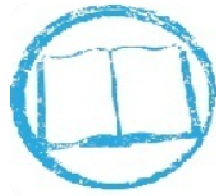
Melt the chocolate and butter in a double boiler over low heat. Once cool but still liquid, pour over middle layer and chill in refrigerator until set, about an hour. Cut into squares using a knife dipped in hot water. For easier (and neater!) pieces, dip the pan very briefly in hot water and then turn out onto a plate. Flip over using a second plate and cut into squares.



NZ-Ed Show

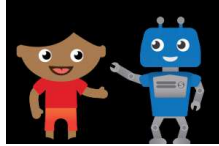

We created a display of statements and photos from Christchurch schools and got a great response from other exhibitors to our challenge to support Christchurch, especially in light of the Government announcements.

We have donated our website access to Christchurch city schools. If you have friends teaching down there – check that their school is aware of and has taken up this offer!

We want to share with you one of the responses from Burwood School:

- one staff member passed away from heart attack in April, linked directly to earthquake stress;
- half of our enrolment zone is 'red' zone - our roll has already dropped by more than 150 and there are more to come;
- we are finding more OOZ applications of very needy students who are absorbing out learning support provision;
- more than 25% of my staff are red zoned and have ongoing issues re EQC and insurance;
- we lost our hall last Feb - 17 months of no indoor assemblies, gymnastics, PMP, wet lunchtime play, parent evenings, team hui, community meetings, school discos etc;
- our children are fragile - several have developed weather phobias - wind brings on hysteria;
- our children and parents have short fuses and can't withstand the slightest inconvenience or bump in the playground - catastrophising is frequent; (and with our staff!)
- surplus staffing is hanging over our teachers;
- cuts to hours and possible redundancies for our support staff - cuts to our funding mean cuts to jobs;
- our paved surfaces are damaged - netball courts out of action for games;
- our families are under huge financial pressure - when the local intermediate visited our Year 6 kids, every

question our kids asked was 'how much does it cost to....?';

- parents who live right next to the school are considering starting their children at other schools as they worry we'll close;
- we were told we'd know what was happening in Chch by the end of Aug - we're still waiting. The rumours flying around this year have been exceedingly worrying for our staff (eg we will be closed, we will be amalgamated etc)

Statements such as this convinced us we want to do all we can to help and support our colleagues in Christchurch.
